Putting conservation at the heart of the community



Supporting conservation in the Channel Islands for 28 years

2018 marks 28 years of the Insurance Corporation Conservation Awards in the Channel Islands.

The awards recognise those people who undertake projects that display their concern for the environment. The aim of the competition is to bring these efforts to the attention of others and, as a consequence, to highlight the important environmental conservation work that takes place throughout the Channel Islands.

The competition encourages conservation projects, no matter how large or small, and whatever stage in the process, emphasis being placed on nature conservation.

1 The Best Conservation Project

£1,500 main prize and £1,000 runner-up. This encourages entries from individuals, families, schools, conservation and environmental groups or organisations, companies, landscaping firms, States departments and parishes.

2 The Peter Walpole People's Choice Award

Created in honour of Peter Walpole, the founder of Insurance Corporation and the Conservation Awards. All short-listed entries will be placed on the Insurance Corporation's website where islanders can vote for their favourite. The entry with the most votes will receive £500 to put towards their project.

3 The Young Conservationist of the Year Award

Insurance Corporation are on the look out for young conservationists (under-18) working individually or as part of a group in the islands. A prize fund of up to £250 could be put towards their project.

4 The Best School Project

We would like to offer £500 to the best school entrant. This award gives schools the opportunity to increase the public awareness of their conservation projects created by the pupils as part of their school curriculum.

Conditions of Entry

- The closing date for entries is Sunday 29 April 2018.
- Completed entry forms are to be taken or sent to Crowd Media, Richmond House, Ann's Place, St Peter Port, Guernsey, GY1 3WP or email: ollie@crowdmedia.co.uk
- The competition encourages conservation projects, no matter how large or small, and whatever stage in the process, emphasis being placed on nature conservation.
- One entrant may submit any number of projects as long as each submission has a separate entry form.
- A third party may nominate a project undertaken by another provided approval is sought beforehand.
- The prize money for the 'Best Conservation Projects' will be awarded on the understanding that it will be used for the further enhancement of the project or further nature conservation projects.
- Projects that have been entered in the past can again be entered if further enhancement is evident.
- Judging will take place in Guernsey on Wednesday 16 May 2018 and in Jersey on Wednesday 23 May 2018.
- The winners will be announced at a presentation on Wednesday 20 June at The Farmhouse in Guernsey at 12.30pm and Wednesday 27 June at 12.30pm at The Pomme D'or in Jersey. All entrants are invited to attend these presentations.
- Please note, while we encourage entries from Alderney, Sark and Herm, we cannot guarantee that the judges will be able to travel to other islands to judge the project. Those that fall into this category will be contacted prior to the judging day to work out an alternative way of speaking to project organisers.
